Hinduism	Students will explore the origins of Hinduism, said to be older than time. This will start their journey of learning about the Eastern religions through Year 8. Students will examine the Hindu concepts of the Trimurti, worship and Ahimsa. They will also look at the life and times of Gandhi.
